

Clinical Pharmacy and Pharmacotherapy II

Topics:

The lecture is split into two parts: clinical pharmacy and pharmacotherapy. The lecture on clinical pharmacy covers basic principles of pharmacokinetics and -dynamics, pharmacogenetics, pharmaceutical care and individualized drug therapy as well as the concepts of clinical study design, evidence-based-medicine, risk-benefit-analysis, pharmacovigilance, pharmacoepidemiology and -economy. The lecture on pharmacotherapy covers the pathology of diseases with increased need for pharmaceutical care, especially chronic diseases, and their evidence-based and guideline-driven treatment. Special care is given to drug interactions and to the pharmacotherapy of special groups such as pregnant women, pediatric or geriatric patients and patients with renal or hepatic insufficiency.
