

Accreditation of bachelor's theses (double degree program or partial accreditation)

Case 1: Double degree program

Applies to students enrolled in the double degree program **B.Sc. Chemistry and B.Sc. Business Chemistry**. The bachelor's thesis for Chemistry already contains a business aspect. The thesis can be accredited for the bachelor's degree in Business Chemistry.

Applies to students enrolled in the double degree program **B.Sc. Biochemistry and B.Sc. Chemistry**. The bachelor's thesis in Biochemistry can be accredited for the B.Sc. in Chemistry.

Applies to students enrolled in the double degree program **B.Sc. Business Chemistry and B.Sc. Chemistry**. The bachelor's thesis in Business Chemistry can be used for the B.Sc. in Chemistry.

General notes:

- An original copy of the thesis is to be submitted to the Examination Office for Chemistry for archival purposes. In addition, a copy of the thesis in PDF format is to be included with the online form for forwarding to the supervisor.

Case 2: Partial accreditation from a different program studied at Universität Regensburg

Applies to students who have successfully completed the B.Sc. in Chemistry or the B.Sc. in Business Chemistry, have subsequently enrolled in one of these two programs, and wish to supplement their bachelor's thesis in the area of the new program.

General notes:

- To register the bachelor's thesis, you must have at least 120 LP in the new program.
- A new topic needs to be chosen for the new bachelor's thesis. The time allotted to work on it is 3 months.
- Arrange with the original supervisor which subfield in your individual case can be accredited, and taken over into the new bachelor's thesis.
- At the end, it has to contain a declaration from the author that the work has been completed independently, that no sources or aids have been used other than those noted, that the work has not already been submitted to another university in order to obtain an academic degree, and that the author has taken note of the legal consequences provided for in § 27 Para. 5 of the Examination Regulations.
A large proportion of the thesis presented has already been submitted to the Examination Office in Chemistry as a thesis in the bachelor's program "(original program)".
- The thesis is to be submitted on time as two bound copies and an electronic version (pdf file) to the Examination Office for Chemistry.
- The bachelor's thesis is assessed and evaluated by the supervisor.
